DRAWING AND PAINTING

PLANE AIR? NO PLEIN AIR I & II



Over 100 years ago technology provided artists with the opportunity to paint outside on the go. Plein Air is what it is called to draw and paint directly from nature. We are going to be taking our easels, paints, and pencils on the go! We will be learning how to draw nature, architecture, and landscapes outside of the classroom. We will also work on making some tools and equipment to store our necessary drawing and painting items on our person. Perhaps we will make belts to store brushes and shoulder banners to store paint. Over the course of the summer our drawing and painting from nature will improve along with our public art persona, beret and mustaches not included!

ANIMAL SELF PORTRAITS I & II

If you had to compare yourself to an animal, who would you be? Young artists will draw inspiration from portraits throughout history and use their imagination and self-reflection to develop sketches and then paintings to create fully realized, enchanting portraits fit for a museum!

WATERCOLOR 101 & 102

In this class we will be learning the patient and graceful artform of watercolor painting. By using traditional painting methods students will learn about the tools of the trade and their uses. We will analyze how to properly layer watercolor paints, what a good paint to water ratio looks like, and how to get the most out of our palettes. Each week we will be doing a landscape study as a class to help us better understand concepts like depth of field and perspective. Young artists will be encouraged to choose their own subjects to further their knowledge of watercolor painting.

We will be drawing with big paper, small paper, charcoal, oil pastel, conte' crayon, and more!

In this class young artists will be introduced to surrealist drawing games to jump start their imagination and creativity.

ARTSPLORATION I & II

Artists can show us what we have never seen but can all relate to. This happens because some artists treat their artwork as a primal search, an exploration into their soul and confront aspects of humanity that have never been revealed. These artists are like elite explorers who travel to the greatest heights or to the deepest depths. In this class, we will examine the results of great art explorers like Van Gogh, Picasso, Magritte, O'Keefe, Warhol and more. We will make paintings, drawings and sculptures inspired by these amazing art adventurers as we learn how to become explorers ourselves.

We will look at Lucio Fontana's cut paintings and make versions of our own. We will look at Cai Guo-Qiang's use of fireworks to make art and make our own smoke bomb paintings. We will also build large pendulums and do a series of pendulum paintings! If regular art with paint brushes and pencils seems boring, then Rebel!

CLAY PLAY: AMULETS AND MAGIC CHARMS

We will place emphasis on experimentation, planning, and sharing our ideas with each other.



New skills are learned as we make stories, ideas, dreams, and designs!

Together we will create a museum that the audience can reach out and grab!


Art World I artists will sculpt clay sushi, craft a bento box, make a small rug, and bind a photo book.

Students will dye, cut, collage, paint, and stamp fabric and cardboard to create tapestries that represent New Orleans. No sewing will be involved.


PRINTMAKING

In this puppet workshop, we will create birds and their nests, but we'll also design forest fire dragons for a puppet pageant that combines the work of all the puppetry classes in performance at the CDCA Festival. Our pageant will tell the dramatic story of what it means to live in the neighborhood of trees.

This puppet workshop will create mushroom and insect headresses along with "Cranky" or Shadow Boxes that send colorful news flashes from tree to tree on scrolls of secret codes. 
SCRIBES OF CDCA


DANCE AND ACROBATICS




